CRITERIA FOR INVOLVEMENT

You must have a sustainable message. This could be human, social, economic or environmental. We welcome messages of health, connection, self-sufficiency and all aspects of environmental sustainability.

- Please car pool/cycle/walk/use public transport to the event where possible.
- This is an alcohol and smoke free event.
- No use of Styrofoam or plastic (including bags)
- No selling of bottled water (Water refill station will be onsite)
- Use only eco-friendly cleaning products.
- Where possible, use renewable energy sources rather than diesel generators.
- Use cloths rather than disposable cloths if applicable.
- Please take away waste.
- Don't provide single use packaged samples of your wares.
- No balloons at event.
- Local suppliers considered where possible.
- Please avoid products with palm oil where possible.
- Use sustainable, environmentally friendly and non-toxic products.

Food Vendors

- Reuseable cups, plates, cutlery and glasses will be provided, with onsite washing up. Please don't provide single use packaging for food/drink.
- Please give preference to sustainable goods such as fair trade coffee, seasonal, free range, organic and locally grown foods.
- Provide information on the source of all food and beverages, especially if fair trade or local.
- If you would like to donate surplus meals or ingredients, Oz Harvest will be onsite to redistribute to local charities.
- Please recycle cooking oil.
- Please provide a vegan/vegetarian option.

Exhibits, Workshops, Presentations and Event Materials

- Provide venue summaries or other materials electronically wherever possible, on a disc or through a web page.
- Consider displayed posters rather than paper information flyers.
- For documents that require printing, print on double-sided, recycled paper.
- Use reusable tokens rather than disposable paper tickets for selling of services if possible.
- Encourage sponsors to provide promotional material through environmentally sound ways.
- Use recycled, sustainable, upcycled goods in workshops.
